MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHIVIST



Dear Friends.



This has been an important year for us, in difficult times. Especially in the first half of 2022, we continued to be affected by disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Then, in July we moved lock, stock and barrel from Bishop's House to our new premises in Martin House on Upper Albert Road. Bishop's House is now being renovated. Sorting out boxes after the move took most of the next few months, but we have been back at our regular work since the end of the summer.

Annie Ernaux, this year's Nobel Prize laureate in Literature has written about the allconsuming power of the internet in locating information:

because the web was the royal road for the remembrance of things past. Archives and all the old things that we'd never even imagined being able to find again arrived with no delay. Memory became inexhaustible, but the depth of time, its sensation conveyed through the odor and yellowing of paper, bent-back pages, paragraphs underscored in an unknown hand, had disappeared. Here we live in the infinite present.

We have done our share of digitizing frequently used documents and periodicals at the HKSKH Archives. But we also give great attention to "the depth of time," our stacks still convey the sensation of the odor of time and the yellowing of paper, and paragraphs underscored in an unknown hand have not disappeared. In short, we are entrusted with carrying the HKSKH tradition forward in our indexing, our writing and our lectures and talks.

God came to us in Jesus of Nazareth more than two thousand years ago, and we celebrate this event through our history and in our faith today. Best wishes for the Christmas season and for the New Year.

2012

- The Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Archives was set up with offices in the Bishop's House on Lower Albert Road in Central, Hong Kong.
- The Revd Professor Philip L. Wickeri was appointed by Archbishop Paul Kwong as the Provincial Archivist.
- To celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Chung Hua Sheng Kung Hui, an International Conference "Sheng Kung Hui Learning from the Past, Looking to the Future: Anglican-Episcopal History in China and its impact on the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui" was held from 7-9 June.
- Ms. Martha Lund Smalley, head of Special Collections and Curator of the Day Missions Collection at the Yale University Divinity School Library, was invited to conduct a Workshop on Archives Management for the Archives in June after the International Conference.

2013



- Organizing and indexing of Archives records and photos was begun.
- Our Internship Program started and also collaboration with overseas Anglian bodies and local universities.
- Publication of Book: *Imperial to International: A History of St. John's Cathedral, Hong Kong*, Stuart Wolfendale, was published in May by Hong Kong University Press (HKU Press).

2014


- Visited local, overseas and Mainland China Archives to acquire materials on Hong Kong Anglican Church and Chung Hua Sheng Kung Hui.
- Publication of book: 《萬代要稱妳有福 香港聖公會聖馬利亞堂史(1912-2012)》, 魏克利 (Philip L. Wickeri) / 陳睿文 (Chen Ruiwen), was published in December by Christian Study Centre on Chinese Religion & Culture (CSCCRC).

2015

- The Archives Advisory Committee was established and held its 1st Meeting on 16 January.
- Publication of Book: Christian Encounters with Chinese Culture: Essays on Anglican and Episcopal History in China, Philip L. Wickeri, was published in May by HKU Press.



International Archives Day 2015

- Participation in outreach program organized by the Hong Kong Archives Society on 13 June to celebrate the International Archives Day. There were exhibitions from local archives and lectures from prominent archivists, historians and academics.
- Organized Paper and Book Conservation Course for archives staff and members from SKH units from October to December.
- Publication of Book: *The Practical Prophet: Bishop Ronald O. Hall of Hong Kong and His Legacies*, Moira M.W. Chan-Yeung, was published in December by HKU Press.

2016

- The Archives 1st Open Day was held on 2 April 2016.
- Conducted archival lecture and workshop with HKSKH Ming Hua Theological College. Ms. Martha Lund Smalley was invited as guest speaker to share on topics of "Archives in a Digital Age" and "Developing a School or Parish Archive" in April.
- In July, the Archives staff went on a historical tour of Guangzhou with SKH Bishop Mok Sau Tseng Secondary School. We met with the grandsons of Bishop Mok Shau Tsang. Visited The Church of Our Saviour and the Protestant Cemetery where Bishop and Mrs. Mok were buried.
- Renovated fireproof room in the Bishop's House as repository for storage of historical documents and rare books.

2017

- HKSKH Archives Website launched on 22 March.
- 2017 Archives Open Day ("The Prayer Book in the History of the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui") was held on 25 March.
- The History Advisory Committee and the Archives Advisory Committee held their respective last meetings on 21 June and 19 July and the two committees were later combined into one in 2018
- Publication of Book:《華北地區的 聖公會》, 左芙蓉, was published in July by 宗教文化出版社.


2018

- The History and Archives Advisory Committee (combination of the History Advisory Committee and the Archives Advisory Committee) was formed and held its 1st meeting on 7 March.
- 2018 Archives Open Day ("Towards the Formation of the Province, 1849-1998") was held on 24 March.
- Publication of book: A Short Biography of John Shaw Burdon, Bishop of Hong Kong, and the Chinese version《包爾騰主教傳略》,Ruiwen Chen, was published in May by Religious Education Resource Centre.
- The Archives organized a one-day seminar on archival management for two interns from Rikkyo University in Japan, for an exchange program organized by HKSKH Ming Hua Theological College.
- Dr. Ruiwen Chen was invited to undertake a research trip to the U.K. and more than 4000 photos of documents were obtained from Lambeth Palace Library and Birmingham University Library (CMS Publication).
- Publication of book: Christian Women in Chinese Society, Wai Ching Angela Wong & Patricia P.K. Chiu, HKU Press together with a Chinese book about Anglican women 《聖公會敍事: 基督教婦女與華人會》陳睿文,周舒燕, The Commercial Press (HK) Ltd. were published in 2018 and a book launch for the two books was held in October.









- 2019 Archives Open Day ("Education for A Better Society: Historical Contributions of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Schools") was held on 30 March.
- An additional column "Photo of the Week" and a new searchable function for online resources was added to the Archives website in June.
- The Provincial Archivist and Dr. Chen Ruiwen were invited to visit the Vatican Library after attending a Conference in Germany in 2019. They spent three days there.
- Publication of Book: Thy Kingdom Come: A Photographic History of Anglicanism in Hong Kong, Macau, and Mainland China, Philip L. Wickeri and Ruiwen Chen, was published in July by HKU Press and a book launch was held on 18 September.

2020

- The Archives were closed for visitors and researchers in February due to the pandemic and re-opened for research on 4 May 2020 on a limited basis.
- An 8-session Paper and Book Conservation Course together with a one-day practical workshop was conducted from July to November.

2021

- Archives Facebook Page was launched in January.
- Volunteer Work Program commenced in March. The volunteers were recruited via SKH churches or internal referral to assist in the Archives work.
- Virtual Tour of HKSKH Archives, in co-operation with Ming Hua Theological College, Japanese universities and Charles Sturt University of Australia, was conducted on 12 June.
- Rubbing work to the stone signage of St. Paul's College school motto "聖保羅書院 恭 敬天主 愛人如己" in the Bishop's House garden was carried out by a conservation specialist appointed by St. Paul's College in July.
- The Archivist was invited to join the Advisory Committee of St. John's College Archives in August.
- Publication of book: Hong Kong's Last English Bishop: The Life and Times of John Gilbert Hindley Baker, Philip L. Wickeri, was published in October by HKU Press and a book launch was held on 16 October.
- Happy Valley Cemetery Historical Tour with a group of 30 people was organized on 23 October.
- Publication of book: A Short Biography of Charles Ridley Duppuy, Bishop of Hong Kong, in English by Tim Yung and its translated version 《杜培義主教略傳》by Florence Leong, were published in November by the Religious Education and Resource Centre.

New Acquisitions


The Archives was enriched by a number of new accquisition, via donation, internal transfer and purchase in 2022, including historical photo, artefact, liturgical pamphlets and books.

"Hong Kong - Upper College Road", c.1869.

Upper College Road is now known as Upper Albert Road. The building in the distance is the Upper College and was an annex of St. Paul's College.

Interns




Board Meeting in the Bishop's House in May


Website Statistics

Website Monthly Activities


Visitors (Most Active Countries & Regions)

Records Indexing & Digitization Work

The indexing and digitization work of the archives is still ongoing. We started the indexing of some of the CHSKH records and historical periodicals, including *St. John's Review* which was published from 1929 to 2012. Most of the Constitutions and Synod books have been digitized.

Conservation Work



Our Archives conservation work includes preservation and restoration. We always try to preserve our records in good conditions in order to extend their life expectancy and avoid causing further damages. On the other hand, to restore damaged or fragile historical documents and important records to their original state or better state.

Future Plans



- Establish online catalogue of our Archives and make more digitized materials available for research.
- In order to improve the management of records and retrieval capacity, the Archives are considering of using the RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) System.
- In consideration of the increase rate of records and the limited storage space in our repository, part of our records will be stored off-site.

MAP EXHIBITION

The exhibition "Christianity And the Mapping of China" will be one of the events celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the founding of the Province of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui in 2023. The exhibition will be held at St. John's Cathedral in April next year with exhibits of maps and some historical items.

In the coming year, talks about the importance of mapping will be conducted. The Archives will also co-operate with HKSKH Ming Hua Theological College for conducting talks and seminars about the history of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui and some other topics related to the Archives work.
