

In addition to the projects and publications discussed in these pages, our ongoing work of organization, indexing and conservation continues. We have set up a data base which covers all HKSKH clergy from the mid nineteenth century to the present. The data base is not complete, however, and we welcome any information from friends and family members which would help to complete our records. This year, we have received several important donations of archival materials from church members and former staff which



We have begun also reorganizing all of our files and encasing them in acid-free boxes which will help in conservation. This is an enormous job for we have more than 3,000 file folders. It will take at least six months to complete.

Archives Open Day 2018

The Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Archives held its Third Open Day on 24th March 2018. The event began with Archbishop Paul Kwong officiating at the Opening Ceremony, followed by a performance by the St. Paul's College Alumni Choir and St. Paul's College Choir. More than 300 visitors came. The main theme of our Open Day was "Towards the Formation of the HKSKH

Province, 1849-1998". To celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the formation of the Province, letters, documents, photos and artefacts from 1847-1998 were on display. Through the exhibits, visitors could have a glimpse of the development of the HKSKH from its beginnings up till the formation of the Province.





Book Launch

HKSKH Archives had a book launch on 4 October, 2018 at St John's Cathedral. Prof. Angela Wong and Dr Patricia Chiu, the editors of the English edition, Dr Ruiwen Chen, one of the two editors of the Chinese edition, and Archbishop Paul Kwong were at the event to express gratitude to the authors who contributed to the book as well as pay tribute to women who contributed to the Church. Both versions of



the book contain essays from veteran scholars and rising stars in their fields. The books have garnered praises from academics in prestigious institutions around the world.

In addition, in 2018 archival staff made research trips to the CMS Archives at the University of Birmingham; the Lambeth Palace Archives; and the Archives of Christianity in China at the Yale Divinity School Li-

brary. These visits involved securing copies of almost 5,000 pages of photographs, letters and documents to supplement the collection of our archives.

Conservation

The Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Archives invited Mr. Lai Ching Ying, a noted expert on book conservation, to conduct a full day "Paper and Book Conservation Workshop" on 3 November 2018. Besides staff of our Archives, colleague from Ming Hua Theological College Library and the Macau Catholic Archives also joined the workshop. Mr. Lai taught and demonstrated practical skills on paper and book conservation. During the workshop, we also had a chance to practice these skills.

Holy Trinity Cathedral.



Photographic History Book


